ABBOTT John Thomas 8399 Sgt 2nd Bn.

Western Front award: Valuable services France and Flanders.

Born 1888 son of Thomas (Farm labourer) and Eliza Abbott of Coventry Street, Southam, Warwick. Spouse Kate Smith (b5.3.1888)married Cardiff 5.8.1912. Children William Arthur b Cardiff 17.10.1913; Mabel Alice b 29.5.1916 Cardiff; Fresnoy John b16.8.1919. Resided: 9 Westmoreland Street, Canton, (1927); 61 Aldsworth Road (1939), Cardiff.

France 13.8.1914 with 2nd Bn. Welsh Regiment History 14th September 1914 states:

'The story of Captain Mark Haggard may here be told. The testimony of **Corporal Abbott** and others is that Captain Haggard, finding his Company held up by the fire of a German machine gun, charged it personally, accompanied by three men. Outrunning his men by 30 yards he shot several of the Germans before he was mortally wounded. **Corporal Abbott** wrote:

"We would undoubtedly have been mown down. I witnessed the whole incident, and am proud to have had such a thoughtful officer; sooner than the Company should suffer he took on himself this daring work."

At the time of his fall one of his companions was dead, and another badly wounded. To Fuller he cried out, *"I'm done, get back."*

Fuller obeyed, but subsequently returned and carried him back to the line, a gallant act for which he was awarded the V.C. Captain Haggard cheered on his men by shouting "Stick it the Welsh," a motto so inspiring that it has been recorded in letters of gold beneath the Barrack clock at the Depot at Cardiff, the generous gift of Colonel The Mackintosh and Mrs. Mackintosh of Cottrell, near Cardiff, who said that this stirring battle cry deserved to be recorded in letters of gold. In the battle for Bourlon Wood 21.11.1917 after three days of fighting the bn was forced to retire under severe gas and shell fire. All the officers in Garret's company became casualties and only four NCOs remained. His citation is recorded by the Ferry Boys at the Front Fund which states: 'These four NCOs then took the situation into their own hands and conducted a brilliant retreat from the wood which had been surrounded for three days and three nights. Without an officer they supervised the retirement with marked heroism and initiative. For such conspicuous service, Cpl Barry was promoted to Sgt and recommended for the Military Medal.' 



Welsh Regiment History extracts: 26th August 1914. At dawn the 1st Division took 26th August up a position covering Favril, the 2nd Welsh being in reserve in the village. No attack developed, but the Connaught Rangers in the 2nd Division had some heavy fighting, and lost 300 men at Le Grand Fayt, whilst on Rearguard.

The Battalion stayed at Favril till 5 p.m., when it marched to bivouac at Petit Cambresis (near Fesmy), arriving in the dark, after a very long day. Packs were sent back on this day by the Divisional Train, but never seen again by the men, and the rations were dumped alongside the road. CSM Joshua [of Maesteg] records: "Cheese, jam, bacon, bully beef, sugar, Oxo, biscuits were there for the taking, and the men in passing, loaded themselves with what they could carry. Our second in command, Major O. B. Pritchard, armed himself with an entrenching tool and commenced hacking off great chunks of cheese, which he handed out to the men."

30th October 1914. The 30th October was spent in digging in and in making defences, but the Battalion was not left unmolested, for there was steady shelling throughout the day with guns of all calibres. [CSM Joshua tells the story of a Private who was put on guard this day over some rations stored in an empty house. The house was shelled, and the roof blown off. Some hours later the CSM went up to collect what remained of the rations, only to find the Private still on duty amidst the ruins because "those were his orders." It was a fine example of discipline.]

9th May 1915: Attack on Aubers Ridge. Two eyewitnesses (CSM Joshua and Sergeant Mack) have related how the men went up to the trenches singing in anticipation of a real successful fight with the Boche, instead of the dreary nerve racking atmosphere of the trenches. The numbers of guns to be used against the enemy and the weight of metal had been grossly exaggerated, and the attackers expected a practical "walk over," and were delighted to think that, at last, all the shelling would not be in favour of the Germans.

"Among the killed was CSM Murphy (Spud Murphy), a powerful six-foot Irishman hailing from Merthyr. He was a Rugby forward, having played for Newport and Cardiff and the Army, and scored many a try. But this, his last 'try' was his best." (CSM Joshua).

24 September 1915: Loos. Gas. By the 24th September, 5,500 cylinders of gas had been brought up to the front trenches and placed safely in position without accident or interference by the enemy. It took three men to carry a cylinder, and as the communication trenches were narrow and often greasy from rain this was by no means a light or easy task. CSM Joshua records that the men were very tired by bringing up heavy cylinders and placing them in position, but were revived on the 25th by the excitement of action, and as before the battle of Aubers Ridge all ranks were very optimistic. The cylinders were dug into the face of the parapet, and connected by a rubber or flexible copper tube to a pipe which was buried in the parapet with the nozzle protruding. The gas was released by turning a screw and issued like a discharge from a syphon, forming a cloud a few feet off. A special corps of Royal Engineers was formed to manipulate the gas. The discharge from

each cylinder lasted two minutes, so, in order to form a continuous cloud, smoke was mixed with the gas.

"The leading of the 2^{nd} Welsh after it had broken through and arrived in rear of the enemy trenches near Lone Tree, which resulted in the surrender of Ritter's force and enabled the 2^{nd} Brigade to advance, was an exhibition of initiative only too rare on 25^{th} September."

CSM Joshua relates some interesting anecdotes on this day.

"Some of our 'C' Company thought they saw what was a German battery.

"Regardless of loss of life they made one glorious charge only to find on taking it that it was a dummy battery. It was a splendid exhibition of bluff. The 'guns' were composed of two cart wheels on which was placed a tree trunk. Near the guns were numerous shell holes showing that the ruse had been successful."

The British had been given small flags to put into the ground to mark their advance. In the attack on Lone Tree a bombing stop was put into a communication trench leading back to Hulluch. The Sergeant-Major of one of the Welsh companies reconnoitring up the trench saw another figure crawling towards him. Ten tense minutes were passed, each ready to shoot should opportunity occur, each taking the other for a German, before a little flag was held round the corner of a traverse and the Sergeant-Major faced a Sergeant of the London Scottish.

Sergeant-Major Joshua records that though most of the men threw away their flags; "one Welsh man was found lying dead on the parapet of a German trench holding the staff of the little flag which he had embedded m the ground apparently as he was killed. Lying at his head was a dead German."

The attack on Hulluch by the Black Watch and S.W.B. was repulsed. The only glimmer of success had fallen to the Welsh, who, unsupported and in the air, eventually reached the trench from which the attack had started, now only seven officers and 180 other ranks. Major Stevenson, who was described by CSM Joshua as sitting on a hill calmly writing reports of the progress of the fight, was killed trying to rally some of the 72nd Brigade.

Loos Village. The most dramatic event at this period was the demolition on 14th and 16th April of the famous twin Loos pylons, which commanded a good view of the German lines, and were, of course, used by us as an observation post.

CSM Joshua relates that during one day's bombardment of the pylons Corporal Horton (2nd Welsh) climbed up to the top and fixed up a Welsh flag which was removed as a trophy the next day by an officer of the Black Watch.

Battle of Pozieres Ridge. Among those conspicuous for bravery in the action of 26th July were Corporal W. Morris and Sergeant Mack, the Regimental stretcher bearer.

CSM Joshua relates that; "when the enemy in his counter-attack seemed to be getting the better of our men, Corporal Morris rolled up his sleeves, and amidst a shower of bombs walked out with two bags of bombs which he threw with tremendous effect among the Germans." He was awarded the D.C.M. and the Russian Cross of St. George, fourth class.

The French, working hand-in-hand with the British, had pushed their line forward some two miles, and the Allied front now ran from Clery-sur Somme— Le Forest—Douage Wood (just south of Combles)—Leuze Wood—Ginchy—High Wood along the ridge overlooking Martinpuich and Courcelette to Mouquet Farm, one mile east of Thiepval, and thence to our original line about 1,200 yards south of Thiepval. The salient which existed on 14th July had been flattened out, and it only needed a last effort to drive the enemy finally off the ridge.

On 12th September a methodical bombardment was opened on the whole of the front, which continued without a break until 6.20 am, on 15th September, when a general attack was launched which was pressed until 18th September with highly successful results. The line was advanced about a mile on a frontage of six miles, Courcelette, Martinpuich and Hers being taken, and our troops got into position for the final assault on Morval, Lesboeufs and Gueudecourt.

It was on 15th September that tanks were first utilised—machines which inspired the enemy with terror and our troops with much confidence. On the 25th and 26th the Allies attacked again, the British capturing Morval, Lesboeufs and Gueudecourt, the French Rancourt and Fregicourt. Combles was pinched between the attacks and occupied simultaneously by British on the north and by French on the south. Thiepval also fell on 27th September after very hard fighting.

The result of these battles was over 10,000 prisoners and 27 guns, besides 200 machine guns.

The 2^{nd} Welsh did not take part in any of these actions, but were in trenches from 21^{st} - 25^{th} September to the north and north-west of Flers. Here the enemy posts were close to our own and more or less continuous bombing went on while guns and machine guns were seldom inactive.

The Battalion casualties were: killed Lieutenants B. C. D. Jones, M.C., and E. E. Arnott, and 19 Other Ranks. Wounded- Lieutenants J. H. Laye, D. L Rees, C. E. H. Thiele and G. Thomas, and 101 Other Ranks. Missing-14 Other Ranks. CSM E. Wolsey, J. Joshua, Sergeant C. Taylor, and

L-Sergeant T. Cox, won the DCM in this action.

The presentation of the clock and bronze figures took place on Thursday evening at the Drill Hall. Colonel W. R. Roberts, Commanding Officer of the Battalion, referred to the number of years C/Sgt Powell had been connected with 'A' Company, and also stated he had pleasant recollections of association with him during his fourteen years as Commanding Officer of the company. C/Sgt Powell had always done his duty faithfully and fearlessly. He asked him now to accept these presents as a token of the esteem they all felt for him. He had also been requested by Captain Harold J. Evans to hand him a pair of framed photographs of C/Sgt Powell and the officers of the company. C/Sgt Powell, who visibly affected, said he wished to thank heartily those who had given him these valuable presents, and he would greatly cherish them, and they would be kept as mementoes of happy days. When he said happy days he meant it sincerely. He had always done his best to everyone without shewing any favours. He was deeply touched by their kindnesses, and he would always be pleased if he could in anyway further the success of the Company. C/Sgt Instructor Powell was born at Barbadoes, his father being a C/Sgt in the 69th South Lincoln Regiment (2nd Bn Welsh Regt). At the age of 15, on 22.3.1870, he enlisted as a drummer at Dublin into the regiment in which he was born. In December of the same year he went out to his regiment, which was stationed at Bermuda. He was stationed at Bermuda about two years, when the regiment was moved to Gibraltar, where he remained until 1878. The regiment was then ordered to Gosport, and on 27.5.1884, he arrived at Milford to take over the appointment as Instructor of the Pembrokeshire Rifle Volunteers, which position he held for 22 years and ten months. In 1889 he was presented with a

Long Service and Good Conduct medal by Col S. W. Rawlins, Commanding 41st Regt District, and has since been recommended for the Meritorious Service Medal. C/Sgt Instructor Powell reached the age limit for discharge in 1905, but was twice granted a twelve months extension on special recommendation. He now retires after 37 years' service in the regular army, being the oldest soldier in the linked battalions of the Welsh Regiment. The many friends of C/Sgt Instructor Powell have made the occasion of his retirement an opportunity of showing their appreciation of his sterling worth. First of all he was presented with a framed photograph of the staff sergeants of the **Battalion** of the Welsh Regiment. The friends at Milford Haven have subscribed for a solid marble clock and ornaments, mounted in bronze figures to match, supplied by Mr. B. H. Munt, Milford Haven and with the following inscription. "Presented to Colour-Sergeant Instructor M. Powell by the officers, non-com. officers, and men of A" Company 1st V.B.
